



SURREY LADIES COUNTY GOLF ASSOCIATION CENTENARY FOURSOMES MATCHPLAY TOURNAMENT 2011

Holders: Jan Gilkes & Tracey Line (Pyrford Golf Club)

Open to players from Clubs affiliated to SLCGA, with an 'Active' CONGU Unified handicap. It is recommended that players carry a current handicap certificate or handicap record with them to verify, if necessary, that their handicap is 'Active'.

All matches must start from the 1st tee, from the Red Tee of the day.

Matches to be played off ½ (half) of combined handicap difference. There is no maximum limit of 1 stroke per hole. Combined handicaps, must be minimum 20 or maximum 60. All matches to be played over 18 holes and to a conclusion. If continuing past the 18th hole any extra holes played must continue in the same order they were played from the start of the match.

The players at the top of their draw will play their first round match at Home. In all future rounds the players will be informed by the Organiser, who has a Home draw.

No substitutions are allowed once the first round has been played.

The players drawn at Home must offer at least 3 dates (no more than 2 in any 7 day period) to their opponents, prior to the contact date on the draw sheet; otherwise the opponents may claim Home advantage. Please note that when offering 3 dates, one must be at a weekend (Bank Holidays count as weekends). Seven days notice must be given from the first date offered.

The last day of the round must be kept free, even after dates have been arranged. If a match has not been played, the player's available on the last day of the round will be entitled to a walkover.

Extensions will not be given unless both courses are closed on the last day of the round. In which case the Organiser must be contacted. Should an extension be granted the match must be played on the first available day that either course is open.

In the semi-finals venues will be exchanged, so that the matches will be played on a neutral course. Dates must not be fixed until the Organiser has made contact with the Clubs involved.

The final will be played on a neutral course arranged by the Secretary.

Caddies will not be permitted in any round except the final.

The use of Distance Measuring Devices will be permitted.

Players must abide by the R&A rule 14.3 concerning the use of DMD's:-

“A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measure distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature etc.), the player is in breach of rule 14.3 for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.”

A Buggy or Golf Cart may only be used by a registered disabled player. A player who is recovering from illness, injury or has a medical condition. May use a buggy providing the player produces a Doctor's letter the supporting the medical reason why they require the use of a buggy. This letter must be sent to the Competition Organiser or The Secretary, prior to the date of play. If a player is allowed the use of a buggy it is recommended that she contacts the Club where the match will be played to check the 'Club Buggy Policy'.

Please email or telephone the result of your match, as soon as possible, after you have played.

If you are playing in the first round please quote your match number.
