



SURREY LADIES COUNTY GOLF ASSOCIATION WEEKEND MATCH PLAY 2011

All matches must start from the 1st tee and be played from the Red Tee of the day.

Matches to be played off full handicap difference. There is no maximum limit of 1 stroke per hole. All matches to be played over 18 holes and to a conclusion. If continuing past the 18th hole any extra holes played must continue in the same order they were played from the start of the match.

The player at the top of their draw will play their first round match at Home. In all future rounds the Organiser will inform the players who has Home advantage.

The players drawn at Home must offer at least 3 weekend dates (no more than 2 in any 7 day period) to their opponents, prior to the contact date on the draw sheet; otherwise the opponents may claim Home advantage. Seven days notice must be given from the first date offered. Matches may only be played on a week day by mutual agreement of both players.

Players who have Home advantage, but are unable to offer courtesy of their course to the opponent will be liable to forfeit the Home advantage.

The last day of the round must be kept free, even after dates have been arranged. If a match has not been played, the player available on the last day of the round will be entitled to a walkover.

Extensions will not be given unless both courses are closed on the last day of the round. In which case the Organiser must be contacted. Should an extension be granted the match must be played on the first available day that either course is open.

The semi finals and final will be played on a neutral course.

Caddies will not be permitted in any round except the final.

The use of Distance Measuring Devices will be permitted.

Players must abide by the R&A rule 14.3 concerning the use of DMD's:-

“A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measure distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature etc.), the player is in breach of rule 14.3 for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.”

A Buggy or Golf Cart may be used by a registered disabled player. A player who is recovering from illness, injury or has a medical condition; may use a buggy providing the player produces a Doctor's letter supporting the medical reason why the player requires the use of a buggy. This letter must be sent to the Competition Organiser or The Secretary, prior to the date of play. If a player is allowed the use of a buggy it is recommended that she contacts the Club where the match will be played to check the 'Club Buggy Policy'
